RULES

This event will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020, the prescriptions of SAIL CANADA, these 2017 Jack and Jill Race Sailing Instructions and the Event Page.

NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the lobby at the West Vancouver Yacht Club.

REGISTRATION

Register before Thursday August 23rd by emailing name of Skipper and Crew, Boat name and PHRF handicap rating to Ian at IanLloyd.2010@gmail.com . To ensure that your registration is not missed by the organizers, make sure to mark the subject line of your registration email with "**WVYC Jack and Jill Race**",

SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be made from the flagpole on the lawn to the West of the main Clubhouse.

CREWS

Crews for this race will be made up of one male and one female.

Convincing disguises may be accepted, subject to close scrutiny of the race organizers

AUTOMATIC STEERING DEVICES

Automatic steering devices will be permitted.

SKIPPER'S MEETING

There will be a skippers meeting in the Main Clubhouse at 9:30 a.m. on the day of the race.

SCHEDULE OF RACES

The first boat to start will be at 11:00am on Saturday August 26, 2017. For consistency in timing, the official race time will be as displayed on mobile devices as broadcast by National Research Council of Canada for Pacific Daylight Time (PDT) at http://www.nrc-cnrc.gc.ca/eng/services/time/web_clock.html

RACING AREA

Racing will take place in Howe Sound and English Bay.

COURSES

From the Start, rounding navigation buoy QB (near Dundarave) to Starboard continuing to Pt Grey Bell Buoy to Starboard and then to Finish. The Start and Finish lines will be a line between the Light Beacon on Grebe Islets and the southern edge of the rock south of Passage Island. Bearings 87° - 267° true. For this event, the length of this course is deemed to be 10 miles.

COMMUNICATION

Communications with other participants on VHF channel 73 or the WVYC front desk at (604) 921-7575.

MARKS

See course descriptions above.

START

The race is a self-start based on PHRF rating. A boat's start time will be determined using a Time on Distance calculation. Theoretically, this should result in all boats arriving at the finish line at close to the same time. The individual vessel start times and start order will be presented at the competitors meeting at 0930 Saturday morning. The Start Line will be a line between the Light Beacon on Grebe Islets and the southern edge of the rock south of Passage Island. Bearings 87° - 267° true

FINISH

The Finish Line will be a line between the Light Beacon on Grebe Islets and the southern edge of the rock south of Passage Island. Bearings 87° - 267° true. First boat at the finish line wins the race, and wins the honor of organizing the 2019 Jack and Jill Race.

TIME LIMIT

The Finish line closes at 1600 hours Sunday August 26, 2018

PROTESTS

a. The protest time limit will be 1 hour after the final boat comes into harbour. The exact time shall be posted on the official notice board.

- b. Protests should be filed at the front desk of the WVYC Club House within the time limit posted.
- c. Protest participants should remember that the volunteers sitting on the protest committee do appreciate the benefits of cool beverages while sitting in the hot protest room

SAFETY

- a. Competitors are reminded that while the race will be run in accordance with the International Sailing Federation's 2017-2020 Racing Rules of Sailing, vessels and their operation must comply with Canadian Acts and Regulations for safe and environmentally sound vessel operation, with emphasis placed on the requirements as outlined in Transport Canada's Safe Boating Guide for your vessel size ([Online Link](#)).
- b. All Competitors shall monitor VHF 73.

English Bay Tides for Saturday August 26, 2018

High tide 04:34 4.0m (13.1ft)
Low tide 11:26 1.2m (3.9ft)
High tide 18:25 4.3m (14.1ft)

Sample Calculation Time on Distance Time Allowance

- Melges 24 PHRF Handicap 99, distance 10 miles
Time Allowance in minutes = (99 rating times 10 miles divided by 60)
= 16 minutes and 30 seconds
- Other boat PHRF handicap 209, distance 10 miles
Time Allowance in minutes = (209 rating times 10 miles divided by 60)
= 34 minutes 50 seconds

In this example, if the 209 handicap were to start first, at 1100, the 99 handicap boat would start (34:50 – 16:30 = 18:20 later) at 11:18:20
